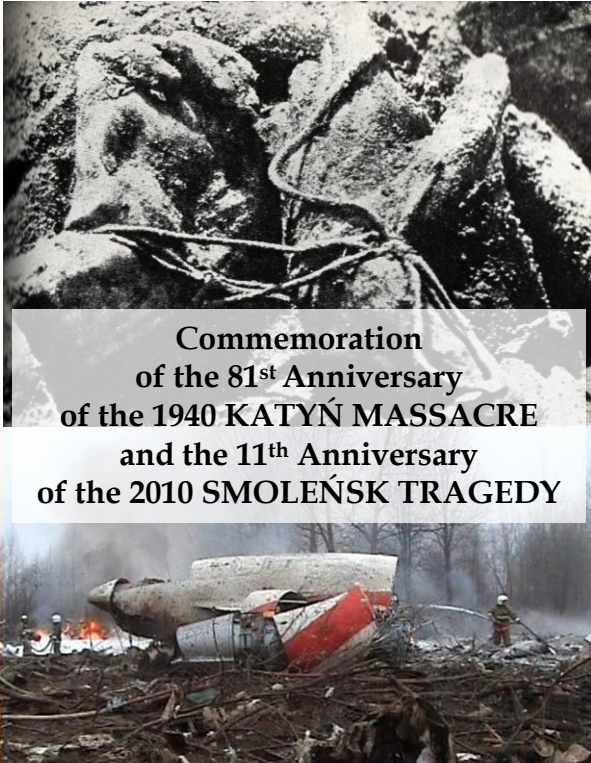

The Institute organizes symposia, public meetings, lectures, and cultural events such as concerts, video and film presentations, and poetry readings on Polish-Canadian and Central and Eastern European heritage and history in three languages: Polish, English, and French. Established in 2014, the Institute builds on the work of the Polish-Canadian scientific community in Ottawa that began in the early 1960s.
